funding, driven purely by the artistic and political impulse to provide dance training – primarily to Black dancers historically and economically excluded under apartheid. In 2002, a decision was made to secure a permanent base for the exceptional dancers emerging from the programme, and in 2003 the company became a fully registered and now internationally recognised contemporary dance company.

FLATFOOT prides itself not only on producing award-winning, globally commissioned work but also on its extensive 22-year history of dance education and development programmes across both rural and urban KwaZulu-Natal. The FLATFOOT ACCESS FESTIVAL (now in its 4th year) showcases the company's integrated and disability dance portfolio, breaking new ground in its work with dancers living with both intellectual and physical disabilities.

This year, we are especially delighted to welcome our guests, **Amanuel Solomon** and **Samuel Wubet** from Ethiopia. The founding impulse of FLATFOOT – to grow dance and dancers in South Africa – remains as strong as ever, 22 years since its inception.



Katim Disability Awareness & Support (KDAS) was founded to transform societal perceptions of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) through the powerful mediums of art and sport. Recognising that self-esteem, creativity, and self-acceptance are essential for PwDs to fully engage in society, Katim is dedicated to unlocking human potential.

Their work aligns with the **Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities**, promoting the development of talents and abilities toward independence and full social participation. Through dance, art, and performance, Katim inspires PwDs to embrace their creative potential while challenging stereotypes. Since 2010, their team of experienced dancers and performers with disabilities has worked tirelessly to foster inclusion and reshape public attitudes.



ABOUT AMANUEL SOLOMON

Amanuel is a professional dancer and choreographer, and the founder of Katim Disability Dance—Ethiopia's first company led by a disabled dancer. He began dancing as an orphan with Adugna Dance and later trained with Jackson (Tadesse Gebre). His work with Destino Dance Company and Addis Guzo further shaped his artistic vision. Today, Amanuel leads Katim Disability Dance, a mixed-ability company that has performed at the National Theatre of Ethiopia and Alliance Française. The company also runs an integrated dance festival and dance therapy projects in eight special-needs schools across Ethiopia.

ABOUT SAMUEL WUBET

Samuel Wubet, born and raised in Addis Ababa, holds a degree in Computer Science and has worked as Katim's Project Manager for the past two years. He oversees projects, communications, and international relations, and has coordinated initiatives such as the EU-funded *Inner Peace Project* and the *EUNIC Project*. Samuel also managed the *We Can 5 Festival* at the British Embassy in Addis Ababa. His goal is to gain global recognition for Katim while spreading messages of unity and equality for people with disabilities.
